Материалы могут быть использованы для магистрантов и аспирантов экономических направлений подготовки.

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Введение

Дисциплина «Иностранный язык в сфере профессиональной коммуникации» входит в общенаучный модуль базовой части блока 1, изучается в первом семестре.

Целью курса является совершенствование языковых навыков и речевых умений, способствующих развитию у обучаемых коммуникативной компетентности, для распространения результатов своих исследований в международной профессиональной академической среде. Программа обучения иностранному языку в сфере профессиональной коммуникации направлена на формирование у обучающихся языковых компетенций и навыков, позволяющих им вести научную и профессиональную деятельность в иноязычной среде.

Задачи изучения дисциплины:

- формирование основ академической грамотности;
- формирование представлений об основных требованиях международного научного сообщества к предоставлению и оформлению результатов научных исследований;
- выработка навыков переводческого анализа текста;
- совершенствование у обучающихся навыков выборочного и полного перевода на русский язык текста, представляющего профессиональный интерес;
- усвоение нового лексического материала, включающего лексику повседневного и профессионального характера, а также основную терминологию специальности;
- овладение всеми типами чтения (ознакомительное, изучающее, поисково-просмотровое) аутентичных текстов; овладение основами чтения специальной литературы на

- иностранном языке с целью получения профессионально значимой информации;
- совершенствование умения составлять и осуществлять монологические высказывания по профессиональной тематике (научные доклады, презентации, выступления, сообщения);
 - совершенствование навыков написания на иностранном языке отдельных видов документации, деловой корреспонденции;
 - овладение техникой работы с основными типами справочной и учебно-справочной литературы (словари, энциклопедические справочники, учебно-справочные издания) и разнообразной информационно-справочной литературой (включая файлы интернета и электронно-справочную литературу).

Особое внимание уделяется исследовательской работе слушателей, развитию у них исследовательских навыков, умения ориентироваться в новых проблемах, аргументировать свою точку зрения.
